


Your Waste & Recycling Guide for the New Regulations

(Applies to business who produce more than 5kg of food waste a week. For **Food Waste** Only).

- Paper

- Clean Recyclable Packaging
- Empty Drinks **Cartons**

Preparation for Collection

General Waste items to be placed in black bags for

Food waste can be placed either loosely in bin or in "Clear Bin Liner".

Please place recycling in clear bags - black bags will not be collected. All items need to be free of liquid and residue.

Glass Waste needs to be placed loosely in the bin no bags required.
